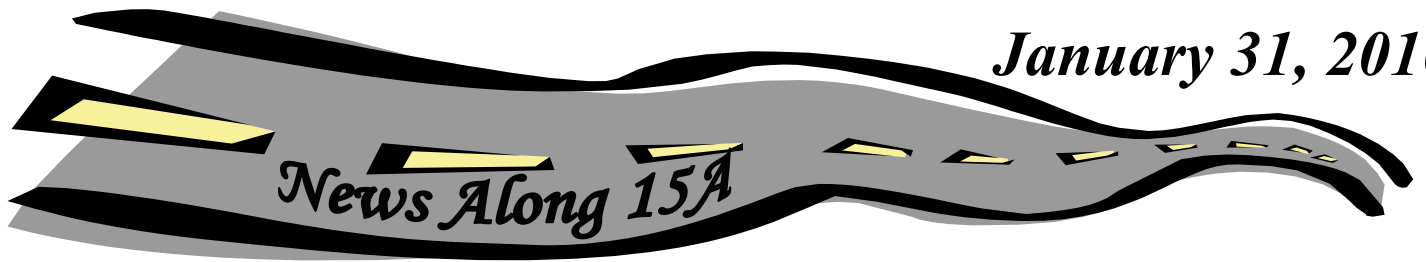

Next Steps in the Process: Parish Leader Selection Process
The RHCC Cluster Leadership Opening is scheduled to be posted by the Diocesan Human Relations Office February 22, 2010. Each of our Parish Councils has prepared a Parish Profile to assist those interested in the vacancy to better understand the opportunities and needs of our cluster. This information included the qualities and characteristics of a Leader for our parishes, the roles and responsibilities of current staff and the work of each of our ministries, building condition reports, financial reports and, the vision, mission and goals of each parish.

On Feb 23, a Representative of the Diocesan Personnel Board is meeting with the Joint Parish Pastoral Councils to get their input on parish Leader qualities. Then that Personnel Board receives the applications from Priests and Pastoral Administrators and their recommendations will be forwarded to Bishop Matthew Clark. Bishop Clark will make the final decision in the leadership structure and personnel appointments to begin at the end of June when the Cluster takes effect. **An announcement of Bishop Clark's decision is anticipated by April 2010.**
